Dear Parents/Carers,

Parking Issues

Following a number of complaints from residents, we have been asked to remind you **once again** that, for the children's safety, it is vital that cars are not illegally parked on pavements, blocking driveways or pedestrian access, or on the zig-zag markings outside of school. Please ensure you reduce your speed when driving near to school and be considerate to our neighbours and pedestrians when parking. It is becoming a real danger to the safety of our children on a daily basis. Our chair of governors is now in contact with the local council to help address the issue as the road outside school is part of their responsibility and school have no powers to enforce restrictions. We are also working with the Police safer neighbourhood team to help keep our children safe.

Ofsted visit

On 30th January and 1st February we were visited by HMI Mr Paul Halcro and Mrs Katherine Chadbourne, Ofsted inspector, for our inspection. They have asked us to pass on their thanks to the children for welcoming them and spending time talking to them during the visit, they said the children were a credit to the school, and also to parents for completing the Parentview questionnaire and speaking to them in the playground. We expect the report to be released at some point in the next 30 days and you will receive a copy as soon as it is available.

Mr Falconer has previously been a governor at the school and brings a range of skills to the governing body.
